if you're not lead-safe certified, **disturbing just six** square feet could cost you **big time**

EPA regulations now mandate that any contractor or maintenance staff, from plumbers to electricians to painters, who disturbs more than six square feet of lead paint, replaces windows or does any demolition while working in a pre-1978 home (apartment), school or day-care center, must now be Lead-Safe Certified and trained in lead-safe work practices. If not, you could face tens of thousands of dollars in fines. These regulations are now the standard of care for the industry and complying with them will reduce your chance of being involved in potentially expensive. lawsuits.

How does this affect **YOU** if your community was built before 1978:

- Any maintenance personnel who does any projects that may disturb lead based paint <u>MUST</u> be certified
- If you fail to comply with the law you can be fined up to <u>\$34,000</u> per violation per day
